

General Education Requirement: There are 9 elements

English Element: Complete the (EN 101 & En 102) or (EN 107 & EN 108) by the end of your sophomore year

Math Element: Two math courses above MA 103 by the end of your sophomore year.

This means if you need to start with MA 005, based on placement testing, you should take math your first semester freshman year and MA 103 second semester to complete your math requirement by the end of your sophomore year.

** You may not use more than 12 credits of math under the 200 level, excludes MA 005, towards your degree requirements

History Element: one history course, excluding HI 109

Lab Science Element: two 4 credit science courses that have a lab section

Social Science Element: one course from: PY – psychology
SO - sociology
EC – economics
PO - political science

Capstone Element: Key courses in each degree program. Your advisor will make sure that you are aware of what course(s) will meet this requirement.

Bachelor of Arts Requirement: There are 7 elements

1. 36 semester courses of 3 credits or more totaling 116 credits
2. 8 semester courses of 3 credits or more in major field of concentration approved by department with a grade of "C" or better
3. EN201 and EN202
4. Knowledge of a foreign language that may be measured in several ways:
 - Score of 570 or higher on College Entrance Examination Board Listening and Reading Achievement Tests
 - Passing Department of Modern Language Test
 - 6 credits of Modern Language at the 112 level
 - Passing 3 credits of language at the 206 level or higher

** language requirement needs to be completed by the end of the sophomore year

5. Four semester courses of 3 or more credits representing two or more of the following areas:

Communications	CM109, CM261, CM335, CM436
English	all courses above EN206 EXCEPT EN240, EN241, EN242
Fine Arts	FA221, FA222, Fa240, FA250, FA260
Music	MU101
Philosophy	all PH courses
Modern Language	all CN Chinese courses, all other languages above 112
6. Four semester courses of 3 or more credits two or more of the following areas:
 - CJ - Criminal Justice (exclusive of CJ102 & CJ301)
 - EC - Economics
 - Cultural geography
 - HI - History
 - PY – Psychology
 - PO – Political Science
 - SO - Sociology
7. Two semester courses in lab science and two semester courses in mathematics exclusive of MA005 and MA103. The courses must be approved by the School of Mathematics and Science.

Double Dipping

This phrase has special meaning in checking for a student's degree compliance, also referred to as a degree audit. Within the requirements of a degree program you may not use a course more than once to meet a requirement. However, it may appear that you are using a course twice when you separate the compliance for your Bachelor of Science degree program into:
